Welcome back to what looks to be another busy term. We are looking forward to all of the winter sports getting underway and would like to thank all whānau and our school staff for supporting these teams with coaching and managing teams.

Our big school event this term is Cross Country which will be held on the 22nd May. This is such a great event and we love seeing tamariki challenge themselves. All classes are practicing regularly and our plan is for all students to take part in a runthrough down at the Domain to familiarise themselves with the track.

On the staffing front, this week we welcome back Miss Ashcroft from being away on maternity leave.

Car Parking

We are very fortunate to have negotiated with the PNCC to upgrade parking spaces outside of the pool area. These are located against the fence of the school field. Strangely the Ministry of Education owns all of the land up to the two poles as you enter the carpark that was originally in place. The school has invested over \$9,000 to fix the surface area in front of the house on the other side of the road. This is not a designated car parking area, it is only to tidy up the broken asphalt and also to prevent people from driving on the grassed berm. Please do not park your car in front of the house, this is a yellow-marked area, and you may end up ticketed as a result. It is very important to respect the homeowners and also prevent damage the work the school has invested in making that area more attractive.



Road Safety on Bikes

It has been brought to our attention by a number of members of the public, that there have been a few near misses of our tamariki on bikes. Often this has been when our students are biking to and from school and when they are riding on the footpath. It can be quite difficult to see some of our younger students when they are on their bikes as they are quite low down and out of the vision of cars. Please have a chat to your children about safe bike practices. We do not want our tamarisk to get hurt.

Uniform Updates

NZ Uniforms are now stocking a track pant option for students coming into the winter. There are two options in the shop for students to wear now. A reminder that students are not permitted to wear



Canterbury or other branded track pants. Also, through kindo, parents are able to order the bomber jacket instead of wearing a polar fleece if students prefer. Orders will take 4-6 weeks to come in, there is a sample in the office and these are a very warm option.



Anzac Day

I am super proud of our student leaders who represented the school at the ANZAC Day civic service. They were amazing ambassadors for our school, and we are all incredibly proud of the way they conducted themselves at such a special ANZAC service. A massive well done to those of you who spoke so clearly and confidently. You are all amazing!

Peer Mediators

We are excited to announce that Peer Mediation will start in Week 5 of this term. Peer Mediation is a structured process that uses a neutral person, the mediator, to help those in disagreement come up with their own solutions for a win/win outcome. It is a voluntary process to constructively manage low-level disagreements. The mediator facilitates the mediation process to support their peers in resolving their own problems.

Students working in the role of 'peer mediator', are trained in conflict resolution skills. We have a great group of peer mediators in our first cohort, who have undergone training over the last 6 weeks to prepare them for their important role in the school community. They will be on duty from the beginning of Week 5 this term.

TECH Open Day

During this term, we will have an opportunity for whānau to come and see what our Whārite students have been learning during TECH. Our senior students will have their end products on display and will be able to share their learning with you. Please keep an eye out for more information about this, it will be announced shortly.

Writer Toolbox / Structured Literacy Parent Information Evening

This year our teachers and students have been participating in the development around Structured Literacy (Years 1-4) and Writer's Toolbox (Years 5-8). This has meant that some of the ways children are learning and work they are completing has changed. We would like to share with parents/caregivers and whanau what this



looks like. During this term we will be offering parents / caregivers and whanau an opportunity to come to an information afternoon and evening about Structured Literacy and Writers Toolbox. Keep an eye on upcoming newsletters for an update about the date this will be held.

Seasons

Seasons for Growth is an 8-week programme for children, young people, or adults who have experienced grief or loss. Sessions are run in small groups and last 45 minutes to one hour, depending on the group's age. As an evidence-based and highly regarded programme, Seasons for Growth has a unique and important role in supporting mental health within your school community. Designed as a support programme for 5-12 year olds who are missing someone significant in their lives (usually but not always due to divorce/ separation of parents, the death of a loved one or moving town).
